AMENDMENT TO THE ZONING ORDINANCES ARE BEING RECOMMENDED BY THE ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS AND TO THE MERCER COUNTY BOARD, AND CAN BE VIEWED AT THE COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE PRIOR TO THE PUBLIC HEARING DATE OF JUNE 16, 2016 BEFORE THE REGULAR COUNTY BOARD MEETING ON JULY 5, 2016 AT 7:00 P.M.

**ARTICLE VI, SECTION 6.15, SWIMMING POOLS, SHALL BE AMENDED FROM:**

Swimming pools are allowed in any district, provided that they meet setback requirements and are completely surrounded by a child-proof barrier, a fence or a wall, must be at least 5 feet in height, but not exceeding a height of 7 feet, and of such construction that a child may not reach the pool from any adjacent property without opening a gate or scaling a wall or fence. The fence must have a self-latching gate in normal operating condition. The latch must be at least four feet from ground level. The gate should be self-closing and latching. All doors from houses and garages must also be self-closing and self-latching. Holes in the fence should be four inches or less.

TO READ:

**Section 6.15 SWIMMING POOLS**

Swimming pools are allowed in any district, provided that they meet setback requirements.

AND

**ARTICLE XV, SECTION 15.9.02, INITIATION OF APPEALS, SHALL BE AMENDED FROM:**

Any person, firm, corporation, or any officer, department, board, or bureau of the County may request an Appeal.

TO READ:

**Section 15.9.02 INITIATION OF APPEAL**

An appeal may be taken by any person aggrieved or by any officer, department, board or bureau of the county.
